The successful candidate will work as a research assistant under the direction of Drs. Ian Ball and Kimia Honarmand in the Division of Critical Care Medicine on studies related to adult critical care. Duties may include but are not limited to: (1) assistance in a cluster randomized controlled trial currently underway at LHSC (ensuring data transfer occurs on a timely basis by communicating with the appropriate departments, ensuring smooth transition to the intervention arm when each site is randomized to do so, among other similar tasks), (2) planning upcoming studies in organ donation under the direction of the study investigators, (3) scheduling and occasionally conducting web-based interviews with healthcare providers, (4) participating in and occasionally conducting focus groups with members of the general public regarding topics in organ donation (training will be provided), (5) transcribing of interview and focus group discussions, (6) traveling to three Canadian provinces to conduct focus groups, accompanied by one of the study investigators, (7) participating in analysis of qualitative data after receiving training from investigators, (8) assisting with manuscript and grant preparation, among other administrative activities.

Hours of Work: 37.5 hours per week (includes occasional after hours/ weekend work and travel within Canada) - one-year contract with possibility of renewal

- Bachelor's degree in health-related field is strongly preferred however equivalent qualification/ work experience will be considered

- Willingness, initiative, and interest in learning new topics and research methodologies (such as qualitative research methods)
- Experience with qualitative research is an asset but not required
- Willingness to learn to conduct interviews and focus groups after receiving training
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills in English and French. Ability to communicate effectively general and scientific information both verbally and in writing at all levels in both English and French
- Experience working in an academic/research environment preferred
- Excellent interpersonal, supervisory, organizational and planning skills and have the ability to deal with confidential matters
