Professor Tahir Masud

Professor Masud is a geriatrician and clinical scientist, as well as the upcoming president of the British Geriatric Society (BGS). Professor Masud trained at Christ Church, University of Oxford and St Bartholomew's Hospital, London. After postgraduate training in London and Newcastle-Upon-Tyne and a Research Fellow post in St Thomas' Hospital, London, he took up a position of Consultant Physician in General and Geriatric Medicine at Nottingham.

Professor Masud heads the Clinical Gerontology Research Unit at Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust. Previously, he was a scientific advisor to the National Osteoporosis Society and is the main organizer of the annual International Conference on Falls and Postural Stability. Furthermore, he is the recent past President of the European Union of Medical Specialists-Geriatric Medicine Section and presently acts as the Vice President for Education and Training at the British Geriatrics Society. Additionally, he is Professor in Geriatric Medicine at the University of Nottingham and he has Visiting Professorships of Musculoskeletal Gerontology at the Universities of Nottingham, Derby and Southern Denmark.

Professor Masud has a research and clinical interest in osteoporosis, falls, vibration therapy, and syncope and has published more than 150 peer reviewed articles in these areas in journals of high impact factor in Aging and Gerontology.
